## ISO CONSTRUCT meeting in Bilbao

On 20 and 21 January the ISO CONSTRUCT project partners met in Bilbao (Spain) in order to celebrate the 3rd transnational meeting. The host partner was Fondo Formación Euskadi (FFE), a training center whose aim is to improve the performance of workers and enterprises through training and learning experiences. FFE has different training centers in the Basque Country and more than 150 trainers with extensive experience in the learning methodologies.

The main objective of the meeting was the preparation of the Iso Construct pilot phase to be performed in partner countries since February. Specifically, it was discussed and agreed on the structure of the different documents to apply during the certification process: the questions

of the written and oral test, the typology of the practical test, the examiners and participants requirements, the type of certificate issued, the process assessment documents ... and other documents necessary to ensure the quality of the process.

Right now we are in the process of recruitment of participants: helpers workers without formal qualifications accredited, with a minimum of 2 years experience in the construction field as a bricklayer, carpenter and concrete worker.

On the second day, the exploitation strategy and results of the roundtables, as well as the quality and dissemination report submitted with the interim report of the project were treated.

## 2nd national project Round Table in Germany

As part of the dissemination and exploitation strategy, each country has to organize various round tables with the objective group and stakeholders of the sector. The first round tables have already been held in all partner countries with very good results.







Last November, the German partner, the Institute of Education of the Federation of Construction Industry in North Rhine-Westphalia (BFW-NRW), organized the second round meeting with representatives of the

construction industry, politics, chambers of commerce, government agencies, companies and cultural associations.

In the last 10 years, the construction industry in Germany has lost more than 50% of sector professionals. Overall, most participants of the roundtable agreed that the ISO 17024: 2003 certification will help to cope with this situation, increasing employment opportunities for semiskilled employees by allowing them to obtain a certification.
